Using logic and reason to understand and communicate ideas, concepts, beliefs, and values. Using spoken and written language to express those ideas, concepts, beliefs, and values.

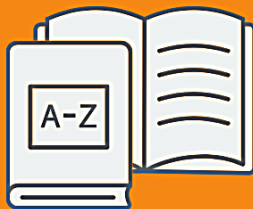


ACADEMIC WRITING

Understanding the backgrounds, viewpoints, arguments, and purpose of academic materials, and producing useful ideas and concepts from those materials.
